

In October 2021, Dr. Nello Forti Grazzini, internationally renowned for his studies on ancient tapestry, passed away. Dr. Forti Grazzini devoted many of his authoritative publications to Southern Netherlandish tapestries kept in Italian collections. Dedicated to his memory, this international conference, which brings together twenty-two scholars from seven different countries, will focus on ancient Flemish tapestries in Italian, Spanish and French collections and about Italian stylistic and iconographic influences on Northern weavings.

Nello Forti Grazzini (Florence, 29 November 1954 – Milan, 29 October 2021) was drawn to tapestry due to the circumstances of life: the cycle of the Mesi Trivulzio of the Sforzesco Castle had been his thesis subject at the State University of Milan, where he graduated in Medieval and Modern Art History, later obtaining a PhD in History and Criticism of Artistic and Environmental Heritage.

These events marked the beginning of his lifelong love of tapestries and textiles, perhaps even 'more than those of everyday life', as he wrote in the preface to his weighty volumes on the artistic heritage of the Quirinale, his magnum opus, published in 1994.

Born in Florence, from 1957 his adopted city was Milan, where from 1985 he taught art history to generations of students at the Liceo Classico 'Parini' for more than thirty years. He was one of the few specialists in the field of tapestries active in Italy, dealing with Italian, Flemish, and French textiles from the 14th to the 18th century, researching the production of centres and manufactures, the style of cartoonists, the particular taste of patrons and collectors, and iconographic problems.

Over the years, he proved incredibly prolific: he wrote books, dozens of articles, curated exhibitions, and participated in international conferences up to his last curatorship in May 2021, shortly before he left us.
